- Authority can be given and used in many ways. The most effective type of authority is that which is offered because of leadership skills exhibited. Even expressed authority pales in comparison to the loyalty offered to leaders who have gained the respect and trust of others. The leader sets the tone. The team will take on your personality- so be what you want the team to be.



- A **Servant** makes it possible for others to succeed and looks for opportunities to move the mission forward, no matter who gets the credit
- A **Steward** recognizes that all we have is gift and all we accomplish is not our own. We are part of a bigger plan and must use our time, talents and treasure, gifts from God, for the building up of the kingdom. This is the only way we will experience true and lasting joy - even on earth.
- A **Shepherd** “takes on the smell of the sheep” and walks with the flock through accompaniment. A Shepherd leader will lead from the front: showing the way

and from behind: encouraging forward movement and encouraging leadership in others. The shepherd will also let the flock move forward and invest time with individuals.

San Diego's Only Local Catholic Radio Station

SAN DIEGO – Since it began broadcasting five years ago, St. John Paul II Catholic Radio has borne much spiritual fruit and fostered Catholic community in the Imperial Valley.

“We get letters all the time,” said Raul Caro, the radio apostolate’s founder and director, referring to the many listeners who have shared that they have a better understanding of the faith and are closer to God as a result of the Catholic programming that airs 24 hours a day on KCJP 95.7 FM in El Centro and K227BN 93.3 FM in Brawley.

Caro may soon be receiving similar feedback from Catholics in San Diego County. His new station, KFSD 1450 AM, will start beaming Catholic content from a radio tower in Escondido, beginning in mid-February.

St. John Paul II Catholic Radio (JP2 Radio) covers most of Imperial County and can be accessed online at jp2radio.com.

The new station will expand its reach to an additional million potential listeners. During daytime hours, the signal will carry to most of San Diego County, excluding the South Bay. He hopes to acquire an affiliate station in downtown San Diego in late spring to further expand the coverage area.

JP2 Radio, an apostolate of the Lay Brothers of the Poor, is 501c3 nonprofit corporation supported by listeners.
